



Bargaining Update May 27th, 2015

This General Construction Sector Bargaining Update is intended for the private information of employers, affiliated employers' organizations, construction purchasers, and other interested parties who have requested regular receipt of the Update. Overview

There is a settlement pending ratification for **1** of the **24** trade jurisdictions in the general sector, and **21** of **24** have entered into collective agreements. Ratification plans for the pending trade is noted below.

Settled Pending Ratification

Have Entered Into Collective Agreements

For the other trades settled pending ratification, we understand the plans are as follows:

- Carpenters will be using a mailed ballot process, tallying the results on June 2nd.

Trade Tables

Electricians: The parties met with the assistance of a mediator, but a settlement has not yet been achieved.

Elevator Constructors: A memorandum of settlement was signed, but the Unions have advised that the members failed to ratify.

Other Developments

Collective Agreements

The respective REOs and Unions are working on the signing and distribution of the new collective agreements. Many of the new agreements are now posted at www.clra.org.

Specialty Sector

Operating Engineers 955 has entered into a collective agreement with the Alberta Crane Owners' Association for the Crane Rental trade jurisdiction. The Prairies portion of the Quality Control Council failed to ratify the terms of a settlement with the Non-Destructive Testing Management Association.
